Freedom Harness



This has great adjustments so it can be adjusted to fit most dogs. It can be used as a back clip, front clip, or with a double-ended leash. It is the highest rated harness that sits lower on the chest by Whole Dog Journal. You will need to order this online.

The double-ended leash

With both the Freedom Harness and the Balance Harness, you have the option of using a double clip leash. It gives two points of connection which can help to manage very large and very strong dogs.

This also has great adjustments and it sits up higher and around the neck which can help with the harness sitting too low on the dog's chest. Overall highest rated by the Whole Dog Journal. You will need to order this online.
